Structure, Governance and Management Governing Document

The Church operates under the terms of the Unitary Constitution of the Church of Scotland.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The trustees are the members of the Kirk Session who are the elders of the church, chosen from those members considered to have gifts and skills appropriate to the calling.

Organisational Structure

Carlops Parish Church is linked with five other churches to form the new linkage of West Tweeddale; they are Kirkurd and Newlands, St Andrew's West Linton, Broughton, Skirling and Tweeddale. The Kirk Session meets at least twice a year, is normally chaired by the Minister, and is responsible for the spiritual well-being of the Church and its members, pastoral policy and activity, financial management, and the care of heritable property. In addition, a General Kirk Session, consisting of the members of the Kirk Sessions of the six linked congregations, meets several times a year to discuss matters of common concern.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. As a nation The Kirk Session meets at least twice a year, is normally chaired by the Minister, and is responsible for the spiritual well-being of the Church and its members, pastoral policy and activity, financial management, and the care of heritable property. In addition, a General Kirk Session, consisting of the members of the Kirk Sessions of the six linked congregations, meets several times a year to discuss matters of common concern. al church, it acknowledges a duty to bring the ordinances of religion to people in every parish of Scotland and to serve all members of each community, not merely those formally registered as members. It co-operates with other churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Our over-arching objectives, expressed in our Development Plan 2016 (updated 2018) are

- to attract people into the life of the church, to services and other activities which benefit individuals and the community
- to serve the community and demonstrate that the church is an active, caring organisation which offers a warm welcome, practical, intellectual and spiritual support, and a variety of activities in which all may participate

A service is held in Carlops Church every Sunday morning. Communion is celebrated on the first Sunday of each month, alternating between a morning and an evening service. Throughout the year, additional services are organised jointly with our partner churches in the linkage. Children of all ages are welcome to all services and events in Carlops Church.

Music features prominently in worship and in the social aspects of church life. The church building is used frequently by local music and other groups for rehearsal and performances. Carlops is an Eco-Congregation, promoting practical action on environmental issues and organising activities which support our open door and outreach policies.

Achievements and Performance

Carlops Church enjoyed a successful 2021, despite constraints imposed by the coronavirus pandemic. It contributed spiritually, socially and financially to the well-being of supporters, the wider community of Carlops, and several charities.

Services were offered throughout the year: via Zoom January to August; blended thereafter (delivered and attended in-church, and live-streamed via Zoom). Our model for blended services affords some interaction between people in church and those participating via Zoom, thus preserving a critical feature – the church community coming together. The model proved sufficiently robust to withstand without adaptation, pressures brought by the omicron variant; fine-tuning to improve it is in hand. Congregation size continues to match or exceed pre-pandemic levels, with approximately equal numbers participating in-church and via Zoom. Most of those who began to support Carlops Church during the first lockdown in 2020 have maintained that contact.

Essential business was conducted via Zoom, and some cultural and social entertainments were offered successfully. We recognise that, while Zoom handles procedural business and decision-making readily, it is less satisfactory for broad discussion, generating ideas and strategy.

Behind the preceding paragraphs lies a successful project to scope, fund, instal and implement a significant extension of Carlops Church's audio-visual and information technology: high performance broadband and wi-fi; new camera, microphones and speakers; computing power to support these; and skills training for several supporters. The upgraded facility allows live-streaming and recording of events. It is both a response to virus-related issues and a long-term enhancement of our operating capabilities. We are grateful to the team who researched and specified the upgrade, and to the Orcome Trust for funding it. The enhanced technological capacity has made Carlops Church the linkage venue of choice for certain events.

The new, extended linkage of West Tweeddale is operational, though it has not yet been possible to organise many face-to-face events to help people get to know each other and work together as readily as we might wish. That will come. The principal linkage-wide achievement of 2021 was the appointment and installation of a new minister. Rev Dr Tony Foley joined us in late October; we extend a warm Carlops welcome and look forward to his impact and service in the next years. We thank Rev Calum Macdougall and Rev Nancy Norman for exemplary service as Interim Moderator and Locum Minister respectively.

We continued to support our "established" charities: local foodbanks, Christian Aid, Mary's Meals and Women's Aid. Formerly, such support was provided by organising fund-raising social activities; in 2021, it was achieved by direct appeals to supporters for cash. Support for these charities has not declined financially, but we have had less fun in providing it!

Much of this analysis echoes that offered in our report on 2020. The difference, as with so much of in-pandemic life, is the success of the UK's vaccination project. This encourages us to repeat hopes expressed last year: that we may return soon to an amended but sustained normality; and that we may engage closely again with our fellows throughout Carlops and our linkage, in order to serve them to the best of our ability

Financial Review

Formerly our principal sources of unrestricted income were weekly offerings; monthly standing orders; tax recovered on Gift Aid, including GASDS; interest and dividends on investments; and cultural, social and fund-raising activities. During 2021 all our income came via standing order or bank transfer. This represents a successful transition from dependence on cash donations in church.

The General Account shows a surplus of £3,678 for 2021. This includes £1,084 Manse Rental income reclaimed from General Trustees Consolidated Fabric Fund. At the end of October 2020 our Linkage Manse was let until we should need it for a new minister. Our share of rental income is held by General Trustees in a Consolidated Fabric Fund.

The Fabric Accounts shows a surplus of £3,478 for 2021. Income during 2021 accrued from bank interest and investment income plus a grant from the Orcome Trust for the installation of live-streaming equipment, and a transfer of £1,805 from General Account.

The balance in the Manse Account at 31 December 2021 is £11.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees' objective is to maintain reserves sufficient to cover in cash – operating expenses for one year (£25,000), plus investments designated for long-term care and maintenance of the fabric of our church building, our share of expenses for upkeep of the linkage manse, and for contingencies. At 31 December 2021 the church held £29,636 in cash deposits, £4,830 in Consolidated Fabric Fund and investments with a market value of £63,976

A reserves policy is necessary to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. The members of the Kirk Session are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Carlops Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021 which are set out on pages 7-11.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

Money set aside for repair and maintenance of the fabric of the church.

Manse Fund

This is a fund held by St Andrew's Church into which all six linkage churches contribute for upgrading the fabric of the Manse. It has no direct income but is funded by transfer from other Funds as required by the Kirk Session.

Since 26 October 2020 the manse has been rented pending the calling of a new minister to an extended linkage. That rental is scheduled to terminate on 21 June 2022 since we now have a new minister in place.
